Funding Campaign

The Government's funding announcement on 17 July was disappointing and a return to smoke and mirrors statements on school funding. Not only is the £1.3bn pledged well below the £11.6bn needed by 2022 but this money was also diverted from other parts of the education budget.

Schools are already making cuts in resources, curriculum choices and activities for students and in teaching and support staff posts. The General Election showed that education funding is hugely important to voters and here in Enfield that was made particularly clear in Southgate.



Greening's announcement was prompted by the July 16th Carnival Against the Cuts march, when Enfield NUT members marched side by side with other divisions, parents and children. Members from Oasis Hadley, St Ignatius, Edmonton County, Houndsfield Primary and Bowes Primary were all in attendance, with Oasis Hadley sending the most members and winning the free first round of drinks. We are looking forward to seeing you all at the next demonstration, early next year.

SAVE SARAH CHAPMAN'S GRAVE, A LEADER OF THE 1888 MATCHWOMEN'S STRIKE & TRADE UNION HEROINE



Sarah Chapman (ringed) was a leading member of the 1888 Matchwomen's Strike Committee and went on to become one of the first working-class women to represent their Union at the TUC.

Sadly, despite the great contribution Sarah made to the beginnings of the modern trade union movement and to working women's rights, Sarah's final resting place is a 'pauper's grave' in Manor Park Cemetery.

The area adjacent to Sarah is now scheduled to be mounded over and there is every possibility that this will be extended to include Sarah's grave. Sign the petition to place a permanent memorial to Sarah on the site of her grave. [SAVE SARAH CHAPMAN'S GRAVE](#)
